Re: Monthly Report – Council Meeting

Highlights:

The City of Bay St Louis has opened our Splash Pad for the 2013 season. Our crews have made some improvements over the off season. Some minor changes have been made to the pumping equipment which will improve the reliability of the pad along with grading around the restrooms and culverts installed along the Ulman Ave side of the park.

We have also completed some repairs and maintenance on MLK Park. New wood chipping has been placed in the play ground areas and repairs have been made to the existing fencing. We have also made minor repairs to the deck fronting the park. We are currently working on installing some electrical outlets in strategic locations in the park to supply electricity for events. Some major site work is also in the plans to increase the useable foot print of the park.

Al Smith Park and City Park has also received some spring time spruce up work for the summer. Our work force has addressed the wash out issues along the front access and installed a new basket ball goal at Al Smith Park. Maintenance was also performed on the play ground equipment making necessary repairs. City Park also received some pre summer attention. Wood chips have been placed in the play ground area along with fresh sand in the sandbox. Repairs were also made to the fencing and play ground equipment. Our parks are ready for summer fun for old and young.

Our crews are catching up on roadway and pot hole repairs around town. After an unusually wet spring our roads throughout the entire city required extra attention with an increase number of pot holes and all gravel roads needing attention. Thanks to the crews responsible for putting the extra effort needed to get caught up.

Our Utility Crew is the unsung heroes of our City Work Force. Not only do they accomplish the daily work load of maintaining all of our utility services but also perform need repairs to ensure utility service to each and every home twenty four hours a day seven days a week.
